Transportation Planning Technologist

An exciting opportunity exists with our Engineering Services department for a temporary full-time Transportation Planning Technologist for approximately one year. This position will be responsible for:

- Researching background information as well as evaluating, analyzing and preparing technical materials related to all transportation modes;
- Assisting with the development of presentations to Council and major transportation documents;
- Developing options for transportation solutions taking into consideration traffic and safety implications;
- Participating in long range road, bicycle and pedestrian regional planning projects;
- Preparing and recommending transportation planning and operational prerequisites for rezoning and subdivision applications;
- Developing the parameters for consultants' transportation impact studies including assisting in selecting consultants, setting terms of reference, and reviewing work for completeness;
- Participating in various internal and external meetings including open houses, public hearings, information meetings, and Council meetings;
- Monitoring and tracking grant applications and billing for works funded by others, and monitoring account status of various operating and capital programs;
- Explaining and interpreting applicable municipal policies, procedures, requirements, and programs to the general public, government officials, developers and other internal and external contacts; and,
- Performing other related duties as required.

The preferred candidate will possess: sound knowledge of transportation planning principles, procedures, standards, objectives, methods and techniques related to the work; considerable knowledge of the bylaws, policies, regulations, and practices governing the work; specialized knowledge and skills in the development and refinement of sustainable transportation plans and policies including Transportation Demand Management; and the ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with a variety of internal and external contacts.

The successful candidate has completed a diploma or degree in an appropriate discipline such as civil engineering or urban planning from a recognized post-secondary institution plus sound related experience. An equivalent combination of training and experience may be considered. Certification or eligibility to work towards certification from a related association in the Province of British Columbia is preferred.
