3.2 UBCITE/GVITE Industry Night/Student Paper Competition, March 31, 2005

This was the third time the Student Chapter hosted an Industry Night/Student Paper Competition. It was a wonderful opportunity for UBC students to network with professionals in the field. Those attending also got a chance to hear presentations on the latest transportation engineering research being done by our graduate students. This year, six entries were submitted, and the panel of judges selected four finalists to make a presentation at the event on March 31st. The winners of this event were:

Karim Ismail: Assessing the Safety of Highway Alignment Coordination (1st - \$250)

Vener Tabernero: Introduction and analysis of a new unconventional intersection scheme, the

Upstream Signalized Crossover (USC) intersection (2nd - \$100)

Karim El-Basyouny: Reliability Analysis for Crest Vertical Curves (3rd - \$50)

The night was a great success and was extremely well attended by industry. The chapter is working on plans for the next Industry night in 2006.

3.3 ITE QUAD Conference in Vancouver – April 7 to 9, 2005

Four of our executives has attended the 2005 ITE Quad Conference in Vancouver, where professionals practicing in Oregon, Washington, and British Columbia came together to share their experiences. UBC ITE has been volunteered at the registration tables and assisting in other tasks.

4.0 UBC ITE STUDENT CHAPTER WEBSITE

Our website (www.civil.ubc.bc/research/ite) received many improvements in 2005. The website was upgraded to allow students to vote for an upcoming lecture topic through a polling system.
