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## INTRODUCTION

The 2005-2006 academic year was a great success for the student chapter of the Institute of Transportation Engineers at the University of British Columbia's Institute of Transportation Engineers. As a testament to the continued success of the club, the majority of the new members have submitted applications to become members of ITE international, taking advantage of the waived membership fee for first-time students.

### **3.0 SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES**

To actively promote the field of transportation engineering to fellow undergraduate and graduate students in the university, the club has sponsored a regular guest lecture series, a fieldtrip, and an industry night. Additionally, the club has initiated other outreach strategies, such as introducing the undergraduate student paper competition for industry night and obtaining a seat on the Civil Club, a student society for civil engineers at UBC. The following sections highlight the activities this past academic year.

#### **3.1 Professional Guest Lecture Series**

This year, as there was a sharp increase in investment into new transportation infrastructure in the region, many of the lecture series focused on such projects. While a variety of topics were presented over the course of the year, many speakers worked for Translink, the local transit and road authority. This exposed prospective graduating students to local activities, allowing them to become more informed about the evolving transportation network in the Lower Mainland. ### 3.2 Group Tour of the West Coast Express Facilities at Waterfront Station – March 3, 2006

This year, the primary field trip was generously led by Mr. Clark Lim, Manager of Research and Technical Services at TransLink. Mr. Lim arranged for a tour of the West Coast Express commuter train facilities at Waterfront Station. Several enthusiastic UBC ITE members participated in the event and were treated to tours of train carriages and the incident management center. The day concluded with a discussion of how the train system is an integral part of the regional transportation network and the role it will play as the region continues to grow. In retrospect, the fieldtrip was a great learning experience for all involved.

### 3.3 UBCITE/GVITE Industry Night & Student Paper Competition – March 30, 2006

Continuing in what is now an annual tradition of UBC ITE, the UBC ITE/GVITE Industry Night & Student Paper competition provided a unique opportunity for students of all levels to connect with professionals. Many students took advantage opportunity to gauge the job market as well as to pose questions to persons involved in projects in which the students have a personal interest. Students and professionals alike had the opportunity to hear presentations on the latest transportation engineering research being done by UBC students. However, the competition this year included undergraduate participants, which served as an incentive for these students to pursue and demonstrate their interest in this field. The results of the competition are as follows:

With increased funding from sponsors from the private sector, UBC ITE was able to award more money to winners than in the past. This year, the first place winner received \$300 in prize money, and the second and third place winners received \$200 and \$100 respectively. A \$50 special award was given to Jonathan Ho for his participation as an undergraduate student. Overall, the industry night was the capstone to a highly successful year.

### **3.4 Participation in the Student Society**

A new initiative was undertaken by UBC ITE this year to further promote the profession of transportation engineering and its activities, student sponsored or otherwise. Through negotiations with the Civil Club, the civil engineering student society, UBC ITE was recognized as a student club, on par with other high profile student clubs, including Concrete Toboggan, Steel Bridge, and the student chapter of the Canadian Society of Civil Engineers (CSCE). Through this initiative, UBC ITE was able to ask representatives of the student society to promote the guest lecture series mentioned earlier. This supplemented the club's efforts in advertising the lecture series through posters. Furthermore, copies of the posters were reproduced in the weekly newsletter published by the student society, which further aided promotional efforts. Hence, we attribute the increased membership of the club due to this initiative. The participation of UBC ITE within the undergraduate student society has clearly increased its profile among the student population.

## **4.0 UBC ITE STUDENT CHAPTER WEBSITE**

Our website ([www.civil.ubc.bc/research/ite](http://www.civil.ubc.bc/research/ite)) served as the direct link between professionals and students. Building upon work that was done prior to 2005, each page on the site was reprogrammed to a more object oriented style of operation. All pages now link to templates, so that any style changes to the template was reflected in all pages linked to it. Thanks to our talented webmaster, several pieces of redundant code generated by Dreamweaver was eliminated and as such, updating information on the site has been streamlined, allowing work to be focused on industry-related efforts rather than programming efforts.

As was the case in previous years, the site houses information on chapter activities, such as the guest lecture series, as well as the industry night and the fieldtrip. Please note that the *Activities* and *News* pages have been amalgamated to address redundancy issues. A new *Jobs* page was created this year at the request of professionals and students. This strengthens the link between professionals and students, a link that UBC ITE is proud to have helped establish. Each page on the website is updated on a biweekly basis to keep students and professionals up to date on the chapter's activities.

Finally, a poll was installed on the website to gather feedback from students. This poll allowed executive members to solicit interest on upcoming guest lectures as well as other matters pertaining to the club. The poll was IP based, ensuring that one user cannot vote more than once regardless of the status of the user's cookies settings.

### 5.0 FINANCIAL SUMMARY

This year the UBC ITE Student Chapter received funding from the Greater Vancouver Section of ITE, CH2MHill, and the UBC Department of Civil Engineering. The following is table of the financial records of UBC ITE over the 2005-2006 academic year.
